
Sexual Health is Everyone's Responsibility

- 7. Resource extraction & development impacts on Sexual Health and mitigation strategies
- 8. Youth Empowerment
- 9. Culture in the face of economic prosperity
- Social Determinants that impact Inuit Sexual Health



The goals of the conference are:

- To provide a forum where Inuit front-line health workers and Industry stakeholders can effectively communicate health promotion needs in a manner that is beneficial to Inuit communities
- To increase understanding among front-line health workers and other stakeholders in Inuit communities of the impacts of resource development industry on Inuit Sexual Health
- To provide successful models for Community and Industry Partnership in health promotion in general and Sexual Health promotion in particular
- To provide an opportunity for front-line workers to share successes and other experiences related to Sexual Health promotion in their communities
- To offer successful models for providing Sexual Health education within Inuit communities through integration of cultural and traditional practices, among others
- To facilitate workshops to increase capacity of community members and frontline health workers for community mobilization and delivery of Sexual Health information in their families and/or communities
- To reduce the isolation felt by front-line health workers in Inuit communities and offer skills-building opportunities in Sexual Health promotion

ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

Pauktuutit Inuit Women of Canada welcomes abstract submissions for consideration as panel discussions, workshop presentations, cultural sharing and poster presentations.

If you are interested in submitting an abstract please complete the abstract form, abstract summary and biography.

Abstract submissions can be mailed, faxed or emailed to Pauktuutit Inuit Women of Canada.

Deadline for abstracts is December 15, 2007

The following guidelines must be followed in preparing abstract submissions

- 1. All abstracts must indicate the type of presentation for which they are to be considered.
- 2. All abstracts submitted must address and identify a specific topic.
- 3. Abstracts will be considered if they are evidence-based and present a Sexual Health and/or Resource Development impact and benefits perspective on Canadian Inuit, as well documented case studies, best practices, promising cultural and community-based research or significant field experiences with lessons learned.
- 4. All abstracts must discuss either (a) Sexual Health research or programs/projects conducted in, on behalf of, or with Inuit or Aboriginal/Indigenous communities, (b) Impacts of Resource Development on Inuit, Aboriginal/Indigenous peoples, or (c) how non-Inuit or non-Aboriginal results and lessons of the research or program/projects are directly applicable to Inuit.
- 5. Each Abstract submission form must include the presenting author's signature.

Equipment
