# Nomination and application process

# **Nomination**

The north2north Coordinator at your home institution must complete a <u>nomination form</u> on your behalf.

#### **Application**

Application instructions and documents will be sent to your email provided in the nomination form.

#### Nomination deadlines

April 25 – fall semester October 15 – winter (spring) semester

#### **Application deadlines**

May 30 – fall semester October 25 – winter semester

# Residence/study permit

If you are studying in Canada at designated learning institutions for six months or less, you do not need a study permit.

For more information visit the <u>Immigration, Refugee, and Citizenship (IRCC) website</u>. For most nations to visit Canada, you must obtain an <u>electronic travel authorization (eTA)</u>.

### Courses

### Course catalogue

Be sure to select the appropriate semester while browsing our course catalogue online.

### Course registration

You will meet with a YukonU program advisor and/or an international coordinator to select and discuss course options prior to registering for courses.

#### Course credits

Nine to fifteen (9-15) credits is considered a full course load per semester. Courses are typically three (3) credits; some courses are six (6) credits.

#### **Course delivery**

As an exchange student, you will most likely study in-person at Ayamdigut Campus, in Whitehorse, Yukon. If you are registered in a short-term field school, you may have the option to travel to a remote location in the Yukon.

#### Courses

You may decide to study a variety of courses from different program areas depending on availability of seats. Some courses are restricted to specific programs and are not available to exchange students. You will be expected to have appropriate pre-requisites for courses.

#### Language requirements

Besides specific foreign language courses, all courses will be taught in English. You will be required to demonstrate proficiency in English.

# Language proficiency may be demonstrated by:

- A signed letter from the Faculty of English OR international coordinator from your home institution confirming that your English language skills are adequate to study at a postsecondary level; or
- Proof of achievement, at a prescribed level, in TOEFL or IELTS.

#### **Grading system**

YukonU uses a letter grade system based on a 4.0-point scale.

## **Finances**

#### **Tuition waivers**

If you have been nominated by a participating north2north member institution – you will not be expected to pay tuition at YukonU. You will only be expected to cover student service fees.

### Estimated cost of living per semester

Estimated cost per semester for basic living expenses in CAD:

- Student Fees: \$197 per semester (\*basic ancillary fees, all fees are subject to change annually)
- Course fees: \$0 to \$500 (\*Some courses will have additional fees, such as lab fees for science courses. Please review the <u>ancillary fees chart</u> for specific course fees).
- Campus Housing: \$2,100 to \$2,500 per semester
- Phone: \$30 to \$100 per month
- Transportation: \$30 per semester for a bus pass
- Food: \$400 to \$500 per month

#### Medical insurance

You must purchase adequate insurance prior to coming to Canada that includes coverage for illness, theft, loss, repatriation and liability.

# **Campus housing**

Yukon University, Ayamdigut Campus has four student housing buildings, providing 92 units for up to 108 students. Ranging in price from \$2,100-\$2,500 CAD per academic semester. You may apply for a dormitory unit or a room in a shared apartment. Units for couples and/or families may be available.
